Minutes

Approve Minutes of Feb 7, 2023 Meeting

Motion: Approve Minutes of Feb 7, 2023. Johan moves and Titouan seconds. No objection to unanimous approval.

RESOLVED, the Steering Committee unanimously approved the Minutes of Feb 7, 2023 on Feb 21, 2023.

Red Hat's Transition Update

Gorkem Ercan and Tim deBoer are joining the call to give more insight in RedHat's strategy shift following Eric Williams' mail Feb 17 (<u>https://www.eclipse.org/lists/eclipse-dev/msg12113.html</u>):

- Focus on JDT / LSP
- People involved are transitioned over to these topics

Questions from the working group and answers by RedHat:

- Contributing back to JDT-UI? Will JDT-LS and JDT-UI be in sync regarding the feature-set?
 - -> Goal: Clean up dependencies between UI / core / manipulation. JDT-Core shall always be re-usable by both JDT-LS and JDT-UI so that the same functionality can be provided by both.
 - -> Implementing new features is done on JDT-LS. JDT-UI is not in focus and feature parity cannot be promised.
- Are compilers other than JDT planned?
 - -> JDT-LS community wants to explore the idea, but not in focus of RedHat
- Further work on LSP4e?
 - -> No change in strategy / protocol planned
- JDT-LS (+LSP4e) to replace JDT-UI in the future?
 - -> Feature set of JDT-UI is huge, community is used to it
 - $\circ \$ -> Intention: Allow JDT-LS to have the same capability as UI
 - -> Way too early to say, no concrete intention / roadmap
- Is RedHat stepping away from Eclipse completely?
 - -> Less work on SDK, SimRel, as listed in the official announcement
 - -> Not completely gone

- -> RedHat's product line: No paid product based on Eclipse, but JBoss Tools are still provided
- SimRel work?
 - -> Less, RedHat would like to be not involved anymore in 6 months
 - -> But dropping the ball completely / immediately is not the intention. Help will be offered, if something critical comes up
- 3 6 months from now where do you see biggest issues?
 - -> SWT.
 - In general. All platforms. Not only because of RedHat's focus shift. Special skill set required. SimRel / Platform for example, are easier to pick up
- Preferred way to contact RedHat during transition phase?
 - -> Alexander Kurtakov, Eric Williams

IDE WG Action item: Make (lacking) SWT maintenance a top issue Gorkem Ercan and Tim deBoer are leaving the call.

Program Plan Updated - Schedule Community Call (mid/end Feb)

Question: Is updating the program plan fine? Sharon: Yes, it is a working document.
