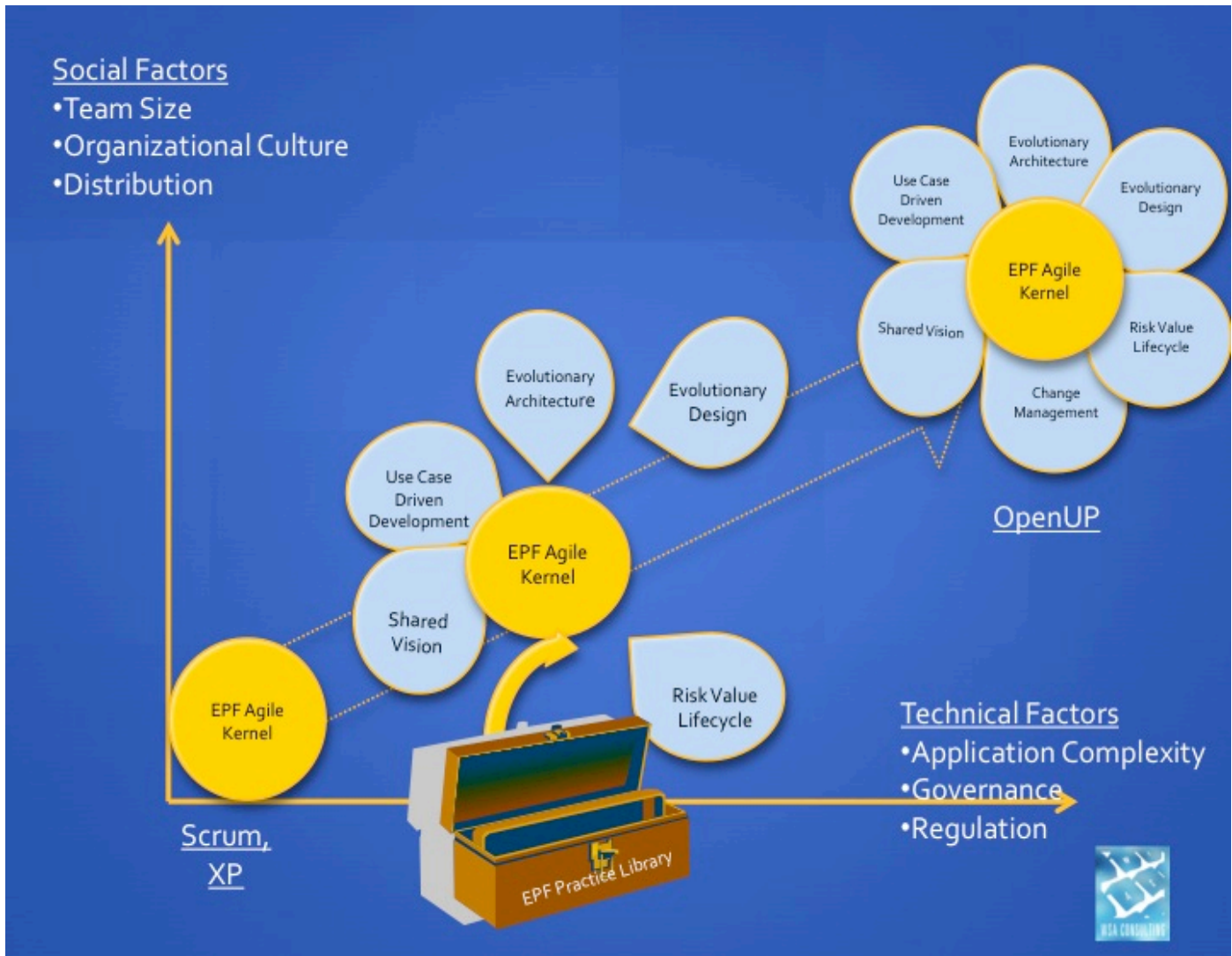

The Eclipse Process Framework (EPF) provides a set practices and guidance for growing and adapting software processes beyond the agile sweet spot in a consistent and systematic manner.

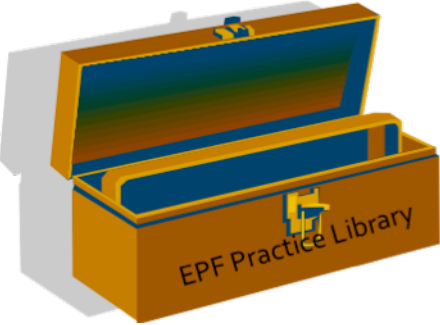
