


Steering Committee



- Steering committee becomes operational
 - Election
 - Speaker and members
- Best practices
 - level playing field
 - open and transparent
 - regular phone and f2f meetings
 - post minutes in mailing list
 - timely creation of sub-committees
 - reaction time to requests < 3 working days
 - English is the lingua franca

Project Teams: Best Practices



- open and transparent
- communicate your plans (and changes to them)
- bug reports are love letters
- respond fast
- document your conversations and decisions
- ask for help (mentors, EMO staff, contributors)
- have working code
- English is the lingua franca
- allocate time!

Project Teams: Outbound



- Be responsive
 - request reviews as soon as you are ready
 - take inbound information seriously
 - be nice
- Evangelize
 - chose the right guy
 - account for 30-50% of his time
 - be out there (conferences, articles, blogs)
 - are social media necessary?
 - be nice

Project Teams: NIH



- Avoid the NIH syndrome
 - learn about the other stuff (e.g., EclipseCon Europe, DemoCamps)
 - use rather than develop
 - file bug reports if the other project lacks something
 - help the other project (patches and contributions)


Project Teams: Deliverables



- show your plans and adjust if needed
- follow Eclipse style planning
- follow best practices
 - code is developed in Eclipse repos
 - there's no such thing as too many test cases
 - use bugtracker for requirements management
- have working code and examples available for easy download
- internationalization
- good and complete documentation, tutorials
- use the right dev environment (e.g. CBI)


Heart Bleed
