IP Policy

- Serious commitment to an IP policy
 - Attracts companies, projects and people to Eclipse

- Platform Ant experience
 - Committers representative blog.



Platform Ant Experience

- Historically moved to new Ant versions within 1 month
 - Bug reports fixed and Ant maintenance versions produced for Eclipse release
- No time to work with the Apache Ant team to produce a fix for Eclipse 3.3
 - Plug-in export does not work on Linux/Mac if installed in a path with spaces

Time Line



- Dec 15, 2006 Ant 1.7.0 released
- January, 2007 requested PMC approval
- Jan 31: IPZilla request entered for Ant 1.7.0
- April 13: IP approval received
- April 17: Ant 1.7.0 in an Eclipse 3.3 I-build
- April 24: Bug 42222 to Apache Ant
- May 11: Eclipse workaround for Windows
- May 22, Fix in Ant 1.7.1 stream; Ant team: no time for proper beta testing
- June 2007 Eclipse 3.3 with major bug

Issues with the IP Policy



- Time required for reviews
 - Reduces code review / usage before shipping.
 Bugs take time and exposure to find / fix.
 - Results in lag of adoption of new releases
 - Eclipse: major distribution / testing
- Planning challenges
 - Unsure of when decision will be reached
 - Committer time and planning to react to the decision
- Technical advisement
 - Pre-requisite determination
 - ALF experience
 - board and IP staff: misdirected time and effort

IP Process Improvement



Increase staffing

 Committer community money available as a stop gap until budget review

Improve tooling

Bugzilla interface, definitions, dependency determination

Education for committers

- Committer meetings
- Reuse of approved
- Correct usage of IPZilla
- Value to committers



Improvement cont'd

- Dates and Deadlines for Planning
 - Staged freeze for IP reviews
- Work with OS communities (Apache) to ease pain
 - Include IP, provenance and change log summary information in a standard format



Committer Meetings

- Build on our successes
 - Boot camp at EclipseCon
 - Committer meeting in Portland
- Task the EMO to sponsor:
 - committer and contributor meetings
 - code camps and plug-in fests



Committer Meetings

- Remove the burden of organization from committers
 - Set the time and place (provide some food)
 - Experienced committers enjoy talking about their passions
 - Limited preparation required
- Sept Members meetings, Eclipse Summit Europe, OS Summit Asia, JUGs, plug-in fests and code camps.
 - Keep developers excited about Eclipse: generate buzz!
- Plan track at EclipseCon 2008
- Get the Committer Representatives out to talk to the committers and contributors
